
Bunnings BBQ:

A recipe for maths success

You can enrich your child's maths skills and have fun together by encouraging their participation in the kitchen.

Here's how:


Firstly, the kitchen has many hazards and it is important to supervise your child to minimise the risk of injury or fire.

Give your child tasks that will help them learn. For instance:

- ⇒ Put ingredients and measuring implements on the table. Ask your child to line them up from smallest (such as a teaspoon), through to the biggest (such as a measuring jug). This activity teaches them comparisons.
- ⇒ Read through the recipe together.
- ⇒ Encourage your child to work out recipe solutions by saying things such as, 'We need to double this recipe and it calls for half a cup of flour, so how much should we put in?'. This activity helps with fractions and multiplication.
- ⇒ Try and incorporate problem solving into other cooking situations. For instance, you might be planning a birthday party for 10 friends. If you make 20 sandwiches, how many sandwiches will each person get? This activity will help with division.

WHEN






Students in reception to year 2 students will be invited to attend from 4.30 - 6.00pm and year 3 to year 7 students from 6.15 - 8.00pm. Due to safety issues, including the number of students, students outside the allocated year levels and times will not be permitted entry.

WHERE

The disco will be held in the school gym. Please ensure that you drop off and pick up your child at the allocated times. The disco is a lock-in event and students will not be dismissed without an adult present. Students are not permitted to walk home alone. If your child is going to be picked up by another adult, please write a note to their classroom teacher prior to the event. This is a student only event. Please rest assured we have adequate supervision and security organised for the night. Parents will not be permitted entry into the gym until pick up time (5.50 - 6.00, 7.50 - 8.00).

HOW

Students will need to bring their pre-purchased ticket with them on the night. During the disco students will be given a snack and drink. There will also be dance competitions throughout the night. Remember, the theme is Old School-80s, 90's and 00's.



Mrs Haggerty's Year 4/5 Class

On 6/6/17 we had a visit from famous Australian artist, John Whitney. He

taught us the purpose and skills of sketching scientific drawings.

We looked at the tools past artists used and had a go using ink and nib, carbon and lead pencils. We tried sketching without looking at our paper, using our non-preferred hand and adding shadow. He

taught us to use our eyes not our brain, and only drawing what we see. The finale: each student was given a sheet and we had to

shade the areas with a cross on it. When we finished we put it together like a jigsaw and it was a magnificent Australian pelican.
