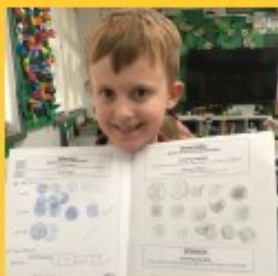

Children's University Graduation - 2018

Children's University is a voluntary program offered to students in years 4-7 which aims to provide high quality out of school hour's activities to children. In partnership with The University of Adelaide, Children's University aims to raise student aspirations and develop a love of learning by encouraging students to complete 30 hours of additional learning per year. Children are rewarded for their participation in the program with certificates and a formal graduation ceremony held at the University of Adelaide.

This year's Children's University graduation was held on Tuesday the 11th of November at Bonython Hall, University of Adelaide. The graduation ceremony was attended by 22 students who completed a minimum of 30 hours of additional learning. Students were presented with a certificate of achievement by the professor vice chancellor of the Adelaide University. Following the ceremony students and families were invited to attend a dinner and take part in activities.

Children's University will continue in 2019 in some capacity. Information on how to register will be available early next year.
